Program details

The program offers **free** stormwater improvements for select homeowners experiencing sewage backups, including:

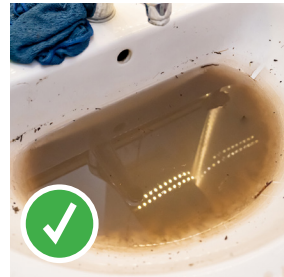
Overhead sewers: Raised pipes that direct water away from basements during storms.

Rain gardens: Landscaped areas that capture stormwater from roofs and driveways.

Rain barrels: Containers that collect and store stormwater that can be reused to water plants.

This program is being supported, in whole or in part, by Assistance Listing Number (ALN) — formerly known as the CFDA — 21.027 awarded to Cook County by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

How do I know if my basement flooding is sewage backup?



Eligible for this program.
Dirty water coming up from your fixtures or floor drain can be sewage backup.



Not eligible for this program.
Clear water leaking through the walls or windows is not caused by sewage backup.
