ORDINANCE NO. 20-009

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 6, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" CHAPTER 8 "PEDESTRIANS" TO ADD SECTION 6-8-6 "RAILROAD CROSSINGS"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DOLTON, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, in the exercise of its home rule authority as follows:

SECTION 1: Title 6, Chapter 8 of the Dolton Village Code is hereby amended to add section 6-8-6 as follows:

6-8-6 Railroad Crossing

- A. A pedestrian approaching a railroad crossing when a signal device gives warning of the immediate approach of a train, shall stop and not cross the railroad until he or she can do so safely.
- B. A pedestrian shall stop and not traverse a railroad crossing when the gate is lowered or when a flagman or automatic signal warns of the approach of a train.

SECTION 2: Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any clause, sentence or paragraph of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person, establishment or circumstances shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court having competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms

contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the Village of Dolton that to the extent that the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 4: Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
